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REPORT OF THE FIRST TRANSNATIONAL MEETING

Monday, 20th November 2017

The transnational meeting in La Solana started on Monday, 20th November 2017, with a reception at the IES Modesto Navarro School, by the Principal Francisco Ruiz Flores. All the partners arrived and presented themselves and their institutions to the school community. It happened at the Assembly Hall with the presence of the Pedagogical Coordination Commission.

The Italian team started by the presentation of a summary of the project S.I.K.U.L.A. to the people present and then the different countries showed videos which presented the main characteristics of their schools.

All the national teams visited different classes at the hosting school (4th ESO) and contacted with the Chemistry teacher and his students. This specific class I part of the project of the Bilingual Centre and it I taught using the English language. Maths and Geography are examples of other subjects which the students can also attend in what concerns the bilingual project at the school.

The Spanish team presented the Spanish Educational System to the partners and, afterwards, they all visited the Vocational Training classes of "Support to People with Special Needs".

The teams travelled to the village of San Carlos de Valle and contemplated the Plaza Mayor, its church and surrounding buildings with their corridors.

In the afternoon the teams visited the Dionisios Winery – La Bodega de las Estrellas - in Valdepeñas. In this winery, the guide explained the several steps of their biological wine production. The visit finished with the tasting of two of their red and white wines, the Tempranillo and the Verdejo.

In the evening, the teams took part in the Tapas Festival, happening in Valdepeñas from the 12th to the 24th November.

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Tuesday, 21st November 2017

The second day started with the presentation of the Orchard Project with a special group of 4th ESO students, specially conceived for students at risk of not finishing their mandatory education.

The teams and the students visited the Sevilla Sncak Factory and observed the whole process of snack production from the arrival of the raw material (potatoes) until their packaging.

Afterwards, the teams visited the La Casota Manchego cheese factory and learned about the process of cheese production, aging and conservation. They all learned about the Manchego cheese characteristics and, at the end, all had the opportunity to taste the half-cured, cured and olive oil flavoured Manchego cheese.

The teams returned to the school and worked on:

Selection of the Logo, Slogan and Macot of the S.I.K.U.L.A. project; the different countries present their proposal for each matter and then a group of other teachers from the school elected their favourite Logo, Slogan and Macot in the staff room. The results were the following:

The Italian Coordinating team explained the different steps of the project's development and the different kind of activities that can be developed during the discovery mobilities. The concept of "Itinerary" was also a matter of discussion, as well. The teams decided that an agreement document would have to be created to establish all the common procedures in what concerns all the activities.

In the afternoon, the teams visited the Wine Cellar Museum in Valdepeñas, getting to know how wine was traditionally produced in the clay containers, known as "tinajas", as well as all the instruments used in the traditional process of wine making. The teams visited the Cave and, at the end, the guide showed some of the several wine varieties available.

The teams then departed to the town of Almagro and visited the Instituto Antonio Calvín, specialized on Vocational Training on Wood, Manufacturing and Administrative Processes. The teams were

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welcomed by the Headmaster and visited some workshops, observing students in their practical activities. At the end, they kindly produced and offered the several team the following wooden plate:



In the afternoon, the teams visited the "Corral de Comedias" Theatre, which is late 18th century building, in which nowadays an International Summer Theatre Festival takes place, gathering companies from all over the world at the event. The guide also explained how the theatre plays and attendances worked at the beginning.

The teams visited the Main Square and watched the manufacturing process of Bolillos, the traditional embroidery works.

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Thursday, 23rd November 2017

In the morning, the teams divided into groups to handle the following tasks: writing the report and agreement documents; defining the itinerary and observation sheets to be used during the discovery mobilities, as well as scheduling activities to be done before and after each mobility; creating E-Twinning space.

The teams then travelled to Valdepeñas and visited the IES Gregorio Prieto Secondary School, specialized in Vocational Training on Food Industries.

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Friday, 24th November 2017

The work session was occupied with drawing conclusions and evaluating the meeting. The participation certificates were delivered to the participants and formal farewell took place.

The teams then visited the Santa Catalina Wine and Oil Cooperative, visited the La Solana historic centre and were received by La Solana's Mayor and representatives from local companies at the Town Hall.

The Transnational Meeting of La Solana was officially closed at 13h and all the teams returned to their home countries.
